The CDC states 77.8% of the adults diagnosed with diabetes report having a doctor who monitors their care, and in most cases a PCP. As a primary care provider, you play a key role in educating and monitoring our members with diabetes.

Evidence shows that with clinical testing and patient centered care, we can decrease the likelihood of diabetes associated complications.

Ensure your members receive:

- Yearly dilated eye exams
- Regular A1C tests
- Yearly lipid test
- Routine kidney health exam
