

# New Texas Health Steps (THSteps) Preventive Care Screening Tools– Texas Medicaid

### What's new

Effective June 1, 2021, <u>THSteps</u> is adding two preventive care medical check-ups screening tools, one for developmental screening of children and another for mental health screening for adolescents. The two new screening tools for THSteps include:

## 1. Developmental Screenings for Children

The <u>Survey of Well-being of Young Children (SWYC)</u><sup>1</sup> is a developmental screening tool for ages nine months – 30 months. The SWYC Milestones is a 10-item questionnaire that parent's fill out about their child's development. The THSteps Periodicity Schedule requires specific development screening assessments of the following:

#### 2. Mental Health Screening for Adolescents

The **Rapid Assessment for Adolescent Preventive Services (RAAPS)**<sup>2</sup> is a mental health screening for adolescents ages 12-18. This gives providers the opportunity to use an adolescent friendly tool that leads to more effective, systematic assessment, identification of at-risk adolescents during a preventive health check-up. A comprehensive THSteps exam, includes an annual mental health screening for behavioural, social and emotional development.

#### **Best practices**
